Message from the Executive Headteacher

Dear Parents,

No news last week and this week everything looks to change. I know you will all be aware of the Government's decision to move to Stage 4 and remove restrictions on the 19th July. While I know that may feel like a relief for most of you, it still doesn't change things for school straight away.

We have had to deal with so many changes and adjustments due to guidance that I am going to keep everything the same till the end of term.

The children will need to remain in bubbles, and we will keep to all the same starts and finishes. The Government have made it clear that until 16th August the under 18's would still need to isolate. If we mixed everyone in the final week of term and we had a positive case in school, then many children may be in isolation for the first part of their holidays. We still need to remain ever vigilant with our hygiene routines and school will maintain strict health and safety protocols and systems.

Fingers crossed nothing changes for September, so I hope we will see some normality back in the school daily diary. We will be able to meet together for collective worship, sing, eat and play together. It is so exciting.

I will write a full detailed plan for September and share it with soon, we are still waiting for the change in law but we are confident September will be different for everyone.

I am sorry we were not able to include you all in our Sports day. It was an amazing afternoon seeing the children together (even though they were still separated in bubbles) cheering and celebrating each other's achievements. We have so missed those events. It wasn't the same without parents but the children had a great time.

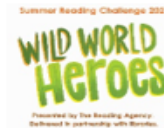
