Quad kids athletics and Tag Rugby.

Oak class quad kids teams all performed with high standards in their 3 competitions and there were some very impressive individual results in all the events. Particular praise should go to Silvester, Tom, Nico, Amelia and Roxy who all finished in the Top 3 individual athlete spots in their respective competitions. There were then lots of children who came 1st/2nd or 3rd in separate events.

Beech Class Hurricanes team narrowly missed out on a place in the East Devon finals when they were placed in a very pleasing 2nd overall. But the Tornados and Storm teams went one better and came 1st in their respective competitions (no pathway to East Devon for these teams unfortunately)

Like Oak class, the Beech children displayed some exceptional individual performances. So many of them gaining top positions in the individual events and Freddy Brauer was unstoppable as the best performer overall in the Tornados competition! While Tom, Jack and Thristan were dominant in the Storm competition

There was one further set of results that arrived in school this week and they really did make everyone feel proud and excited! The Beech class Tag Rugby team that went to the East Devon finals last week WON! There were 11 teams entered in total so this is an amazing achievement. They were scored on their Respect and Teamwork throughout the whole afternoon and they came 1st in both of these values. The RFU is strongly committed to promoting these values so as a school we feel very proud to have been recognised for our display. The children were also scored in two mini skill games. They came 4th in the 'Touch ball' game and 1st in EndBall. Added to this was their 8 tries that they scored in their 3 matches.

Their overall score was 84 points - a full 4 points clear of 2nd place.

The children will now go on to represent East Devon at the Devon School Games in Exeter on June 19th - we think this is the first time a Payhembury team has made it to the County Games. Woohoo!!!

Exmoor Challenge.

Last Saturday, saw 5 teams from the federation complete the Exmoor challenge alongside over 500 other 10-17 year olds. This is an amazing event organised by the Rotary Club. Teams of 4, navigate their way around the mixed terrain of Exmoor for 16 miles, reaching checkpoints in given times as well as answering questions on the way.



Josh, Tom, Jessica, Maddie, Sophie, Tabitha, Roxy, Charlie, Marcus and Silvester were joined by ex pupils Roseanna, William and Toby. The boys team finished with a very impressive 7th place, gaining just 19 time penalty points. The girls came 18th out of 25 teams and the mixed group came 21st out of 58 teams. What is even more impressive that the junior teams are a mix of year 7, 8 and 9 children.
